

PE & Sports Grant Funding 2017-18

The PE and sports grant funding has been utilised to develop our sports programme at Weston Junior Academy, to enhance staffs skills and knowledge of delivery of the National Curriculum and to extend the opportunities for our children to compete against other local schools and also with other schools within our Trust.

The school received a total of £18320 for the year 2017-18.

The aims and objectives and actions taken are explained below.
