Little Acorns - 2yrs+

From the moment of birth the future happiness and development of your child becomes a first priority. At Little Acorns, we have created a safe, caring and nurturing environment especially designed and equipped to enrich the lives of your little ones.

Little Acorns are run by experienced and qualified staff committed to quality care for your child. During the initial transition we are happy for parents to stay for a short time to help to settle their child. This will be individual to each child. The ultimate aim is for the children to enter the setting independently.

We appreciate that some children may need something familiar from home and may bring a small comforter such as a small cuddly toy. We ask that children do not bring large blankets. We encourage children to drink from beakers and do not encourage children to have dummies in the setting.

Home-visits by our staff will be made prior to your child starting Little Acorns by arrangement so that we can start 'getting to know each other' straight away.
